







MEDIAN INCOME (2011-2015)



PERSONS IN POVERTY (2016)




EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT, PERCENT OF PERSONS AGE 25+ (2011-2015)






CHANGES IN K-12 STUDENT ENROLLMENT (2014-2017)




NUMBER OF SCHOOLS WITH PRE-K (2016)

NUMBER OF SCHOOLS MEETING STATE TARGETS IN READING AND MATH, ACCORDING TO STRIVE HI (2013-2016)








HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN DUAL CREDIT PROGRAMS (CLASS OF 2016)
